We have been working hard to make affordable housing a reality for our D5 community, and the community of Beaumont is certainly no exception. That is why we were so glad to attend the Blossom Apartments Grand Opening.

It takes a village to build a village, but together with our partners from LINC Housing and our county Housing Authority, we managed to add this state-of-the-art 48-unit housing complex to the Beaumont community.

This unique housing-to-jobs village model will help families in Beaumont who earn less than 30% of the area's average income. It offers a mixture of two- and three-bedroom units along with community spaces like playgrounds for our children.

Veterans Services

The PACT Act is a new law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances.

The PACT Act adds to the list of health conditions that we assume (or "presume") are caused by exposure to these substances. This law helps us provide generations of Veterans—and their <u>survivors</u>—with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve.
