D5 HOME PROGRAMS For Residents



Home Rehabilitation “Pruitt” Program

- Provides low-income individuals with exterior & interior repairs/improvements to their mobile homes
- Applicants can receive **up to \$50k** in repairs/improvements
- Applicants do not need to own the land

A Brush With Kindness

- Helps low-income individuals in the pass area with minor exterior repairs to their home, such as painting
- Administered by Habitat for Humanity of the San Geronio Pass Area

D5 HIRE PROGRAMS

Up to \$15k
for our
Businesses

Hire-a-Senior

- Incentive for businesses to hire seniors (55+)
- **Businesses can receive \$1000 stipend** after 90 days of employment of a D5 Senior (up to 5 seniors)
- Seniors can receive \$500 stipend after 90 days of hire

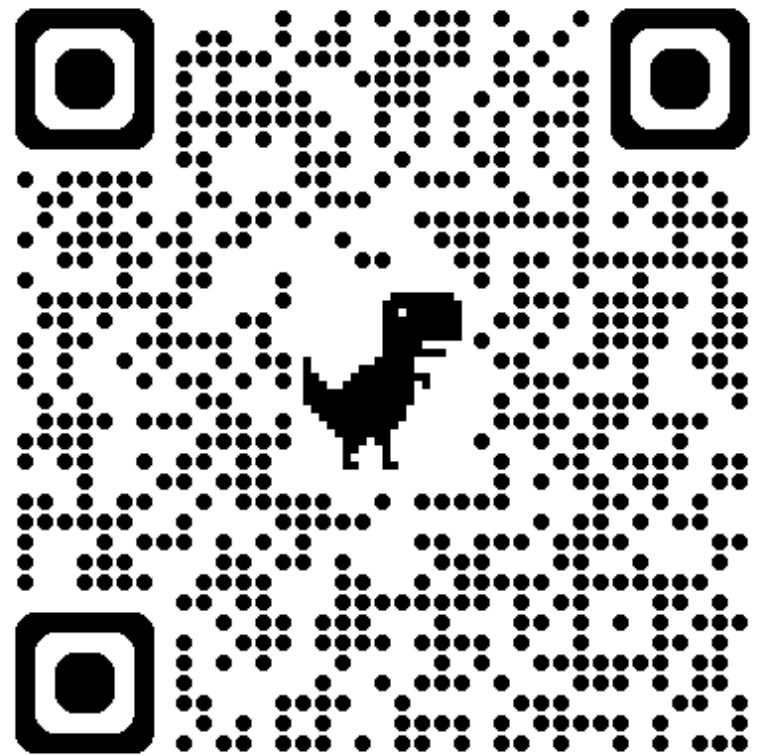
Hire-a-Vet

- Incentive for businesses to hire honorably discharged veterans that reside in D5
- **Business can receive \$1000 stipend** after 90 days of hiring a D5 veteran
- Veterans can receive \$500 stipend after 90 days of hire

D5 HIRE PROGRAMS



Hire D5

- Incentive for businesses to hire D5 residents
- **Businesses can receive \$1000 stipend** after 90 days of hiring a D5 resident (up to 5 residents)
- Employees can work up to 40 hrs./week

Employer Connect

- Tackles homelessness and labor shortages
- **Subsidizes employee wages at \$20 an hour, 40 hrs./week/90 days,** for COVID impacted small businesses.
- Employees will receive training from the HWS Continuum of Care to provide resources to unhoused or at risk

Homeless to Work

- 90-day program that provides employment & resources to unhoused individuals in the Pass Area
- Participants will work on beautification in the service areas, 20 hrs./week
- Pathways to permanent employment

2nd Chance Program

- Helps justice-involved individuals, ages 16-24, access resources to reintegrate into society
- **Subsidizes wages for businesses** to hire eligible justice-involved individuals

D5 YOUTH PROGRAMS

Creating Pathways to Success for our youth!

Youth Community Corps

- Helps youth from ages **18-26** gain experience in our district's public sector (City, County, Parks, Etc.)
- Individuals will work at a nonprofit or government agency with subsidized salaries for 90 days.

Youth Employment Program

- Helps youth from ages **16-24** gain experience in our district's private sector (Hospitality, Retail, etc.)
- Individuals will work at with subsidized salaries for 90 days.

D5 YOUTH PROGRAMS

Creating future Fire Cadets

Community Risk Reduction-Hemet Fire Cadet Academy

- Helps youth from ages 16-24 interested in becoming firefighters develop their careers through training, career counseling, and networking
- Participants will work for 8 weeks at \$20/hr., 20 hrs./week

IEHP Health Navigators

- Places health navigators in D5 schools to provide community & health resources for students and their families.



NUEVO UPDATES



Movie Nights

- Funded three movie nights (\$10k) for the community of Nuevo through partnership with Nuvview Union School District.
- Brought community booths and local vendors to support these events. THANK YOU to all that attended!

Nuvview Bridge Early College High School

- Allocated \$2.5 million to N.B.E.C.H.S. for a new turf and track field.
- Aimed to support athletes and injury prevention.





NUEVO UPDATES

Nuevo Village Project

- As part of our partnership efforts with the office of Economic development, the **OED District 5 Revitalization Program**, will be fixing the HVACs and providing a new roof for the plaza where **Zapata's** is located.
- Providing much needed repairs for a favorite local restaurant and community supporter.
- This project will be completed by the end of the fall.

Citizens Patrol Support

- Funding to support “CERT” Emergency response trailer with supplies (Canned water, etc.) and necessary equipment (EZ Up Tents, medical supplies, & more for disaster emergencies).

Community Cleanup

- Sponsored a community cleanup event to help residents of Nuevo get rid of unwanted items/bulk at no cost to them.

Animal Services & Wellness Clinics

- Increasing Animal services budget to add more events (like before) and Vets. Looking to partner Wellness Clinics and Community Groups with local shelter we re-opened.



Coming Soon to Nuevo

- Nuevo Beautification Project (NBP)
 - We will be conducting intake workshops to revisit “Welcome to Nuevo” entry/exit monument signs/arch
 - Partnering with departments to master plan efforts for community rehab
 - Input on Community Pocket Libraries locations (Ideal locations)
- Storm Drain Project
 - More ongoing Flood Control workshops to be held. Scheduling next ones soon

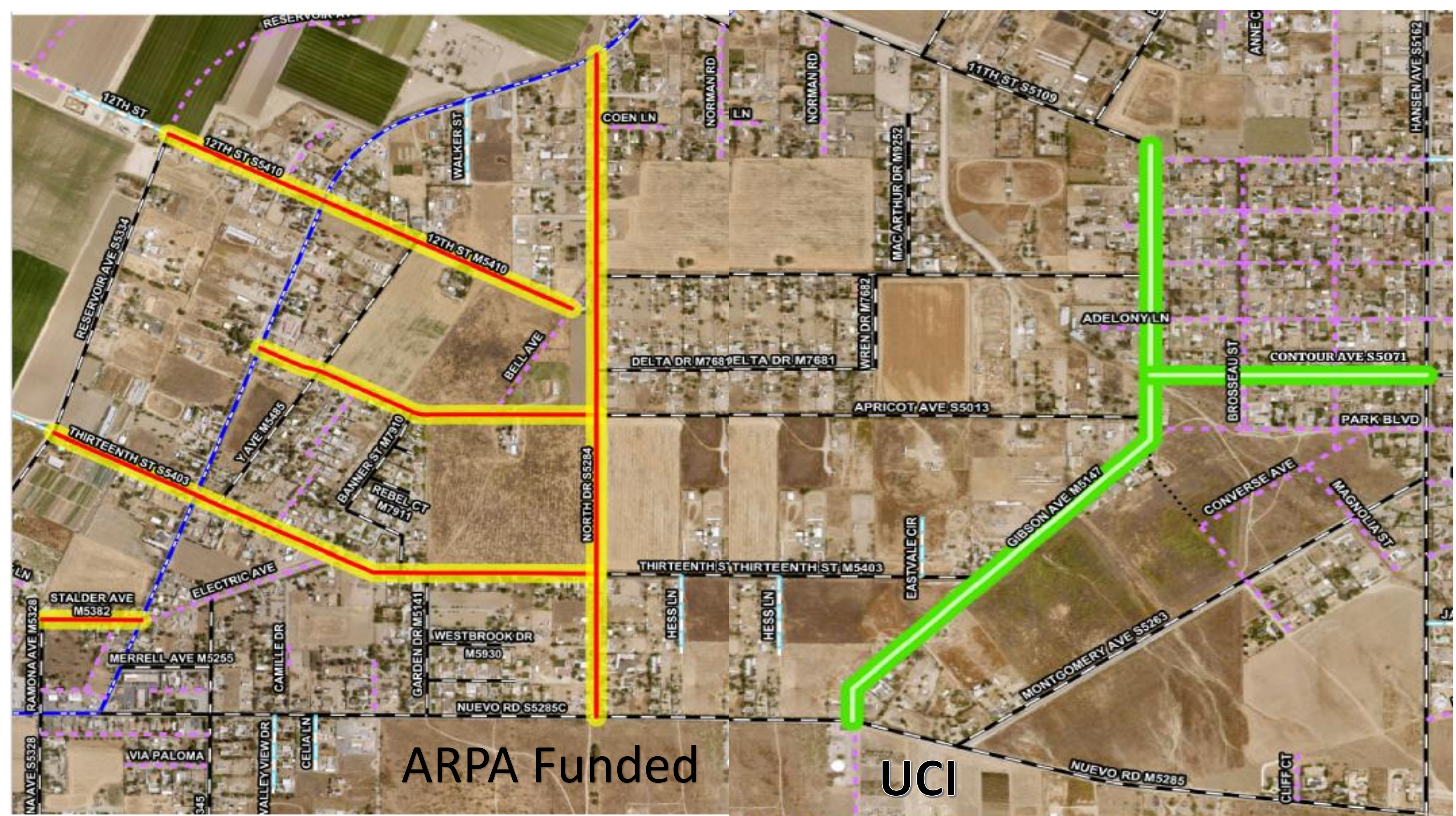
PAVING PROJECTS

- **Supervisor Gutierrez allocated \$4 million in funds.**
- **This will provide needed road maintenance work (slurry seal, chip seal, resurfacing) to the Nuevo Community. On Top of what is already scheduled by transportation over 2024/26.**
- **This will increase the flow of traffic, and quality of life for Nuevo/Lakeview residents.**
- **Here are the Roads we are adding to regular scheduled improvements...**



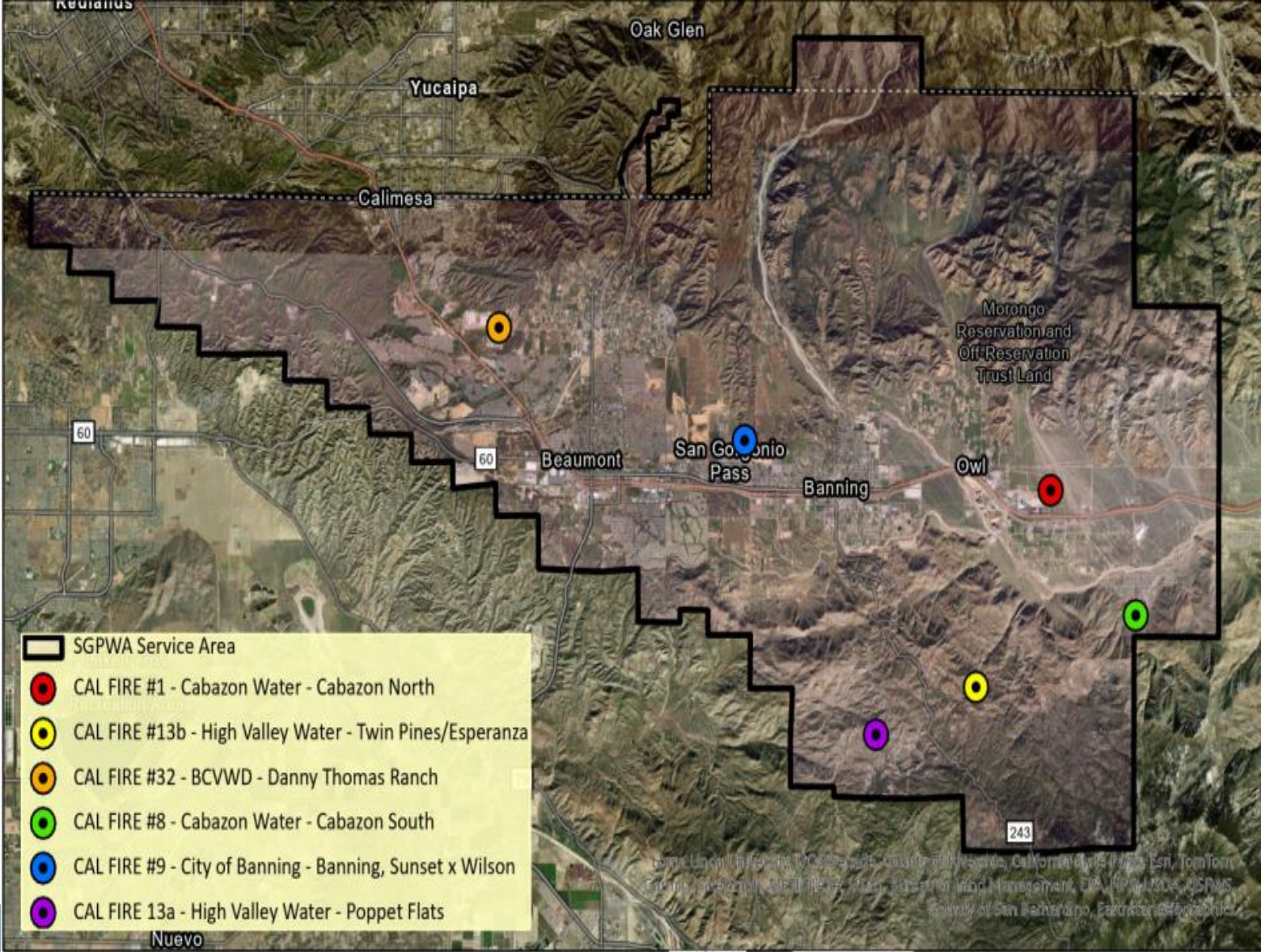
PAVING PROJECTS

- Total Miles of Roadway: Over 4 Miles:
 - 12th Street between Reservoir Ave/North Dr – 0.71 Miles
 - 13th Street between Reservoir Ave/North Dr – 0.84 Miles
 - Apricot Ave between Lakeview Ave and North Dr – 0.52 Miles
 - Stalder Ave between Ramona Ave and Lakeview Ave – 0.15 Miles
 - North Dr between Nuevo Rd and Lakeview Ave – 1.04 Miles
 - Gibson Ave between Nuevo Rd-11th St – 0.60 Miles (*Approving next BOS*)
 - Contour Ave between 11th Ave / Hanson Ave – 0.35 Miles (*Approving next BOS*)

HELI-HYDRANT FIRE SUPPORT

- Heli-Hydrants: Targeting by Fire Season!
 - 6 hydrants along the pass area for helicopters to use to contain fires
 - Heli-hydrants are remotely controlled by pilots to fill upon arrival
 - Helps contain fires more reliably by decreasing response time and increasing accessibility to water
 - BOS approved 4/30

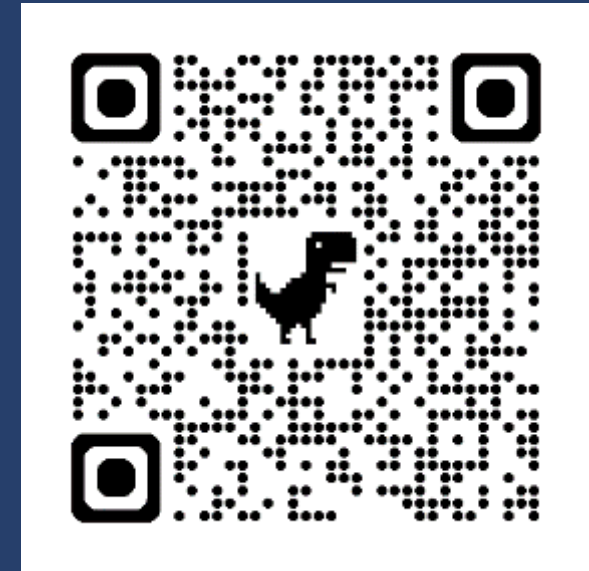
